Non-Public	Pleadings are available ONLY to counsel of record and NOT available to the public - However, pleadings are available to all counsel in the case; See the Judicial Conference Policy on Privacy and Public Access for restrictions: http://www.privacy.uscourts.gov/crimimpl.htm	Access will be given to all case participants. They must be logged into the system with their CM/ECF (attorney) login & password to see these restricted documents.	NEFs will be generated and sent to all counsel of record. Counsel will be prompted for their CM/ECF (attorney) login and password before being able to view the document.
Ex Parte	Pleadings are available to the court and Specific Participants as determined during the filing of the pleading.	Access will be given to Specific Participants only.	NEFs will be generated and sent to all counsel of record. Counsel will be prompted for their attorney login and password - only the specific participants that have been given access will be able to view the document.
Sealed	Cannot be electronically filed by counsel; Must be brought into the Clerk's office in a sealed envelope. These documents are kept separate from the Court file.	Sealed pleadings are not available electronically.	Notice of Electronic Filing (NEFs) DO NOT go out to anyone (including Court users) - These documents must be manually served to appropriate parties.
