AMENDED COURTHOUSE ENTRY DURING THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) PANDEMIC General Order No. 21-03 Amending General Orders 20-01 and 20-06

The United States District Court for the District of Wyoming continues to closely monitor the COVID-19 pandemic. In accordance with the <u>Center for Disease Control and</u> <u>Prevention (CDC)</u> the Federal District Court for the District of Wyoming has implemented various measures to mitigate potential community exposure and transmission of this virus. In addition, due to the public availability of COVID-19 vaccines, the level of mitigation measures necessary to protect the general public have been adjusted. Therefore, it is hereby

ORDERED

Individuals entering a District of Wyoming Courthouse are required to wear a face mask unless they have been fully vaccinated¹. If fully vaccinated, face masks are not required in public areas unless otherwise noted or instructed otherwise by Court personnel.

¹You are considered "fully vaccinated" two weeks after you receive a second dose in a two-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as the Johnson & Johnson's vaccine.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED

Individuals may not enter a District of Wyoming courthouse:

- 1. If, in the last fourteen (14) days they have been diagnosed with COVID-19 or asked to self-quarantine by any physician, hospital, or healthcare agency due to COVID-19.
- 2. If, in the last fourteen (14) days, you have had contact with anyone who has been diagnosed with an active case of COVID-19 AND YOU HAVE NOT BEEN FULLY VACCINATED PRIOR TO CONTACT.
- 3. If they are currently experiencing signs of a fever, a cough, shortness of breath or a recent loss of smell or taste.

If any of the above apply to you, **<u>DO NOT ENTER</u>** the courthouse. Instead, please contact the appropriate person and/or agency to discuss your situation:

- If you are represented by an attorney, please call your attorney.
- If you are an attorney and scheduled to appear in court, please call the judge's chambers.

The Court will continue to monitor directives from the CDC, and local health departments and reevaluate our response to this virus as needed. These restrictions will remain in effect until it is determined otherwise.
