
**ORDER AMENDING COLLATERAL FINE SCHEDULE FOR  
THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE AND THE  
UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE**

This Court entered an Order April 4, 2008 establishing a collateral fine schedule for several federal agencies that perform law enforcement functions within the District of Wyoming. That order has been subsequently amended on a number of occasions. The Court has determined that due to amendments to the Code of Federal Regulations and for other reasons, that an amendment of the Order is necessary in regards to the National Park Service and the United States Forest Service.

ORDERED that the National Park Service and United States Forest Service Collateral Fine Schedules are hereby amended and replaced by the attached Collateral Fine Schedules.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court's order of April 4, 2008, and any subsequent amendments thereto, shall in all other respects remain in full force and effect.
