<u>Judicial</u> <u>Security Bill</u> <u>Advances</u>

A bill to protect federal judges and their families from threats and attacks has advanced to the full Senate, and a U.S. district judge from New Jersey whose son was slain by an angry litigant, urged Congress to pass the legislation without delay.

The bipartisan bill would protect judges' personally identifiable information from resale by data brokers. It would also allow federal judges to redact personal information displayed on federal government internet sites and prevent publication of personal information other businesses and individuals where there is no legitimate new media or other public interest.
