Pro Hac Vice Reminder

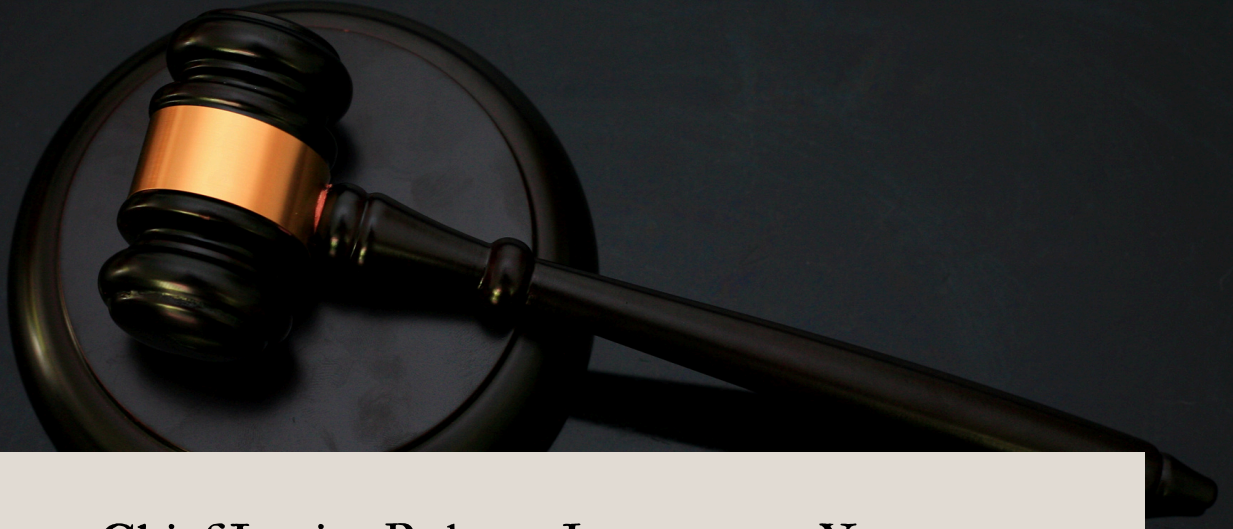


If you sponsor an attorney from another state to appear Pro Hac Vice, they **MUST** enter their appearance on the case after the Order admitting them has been entered and they have been applied for admission through PACER. They will not receive any NEFs (Notices of Electronic Filing) if they do not enter their appearance, and they must enter their appearance on the docket prior to entering any documents in the case or appearing in court. 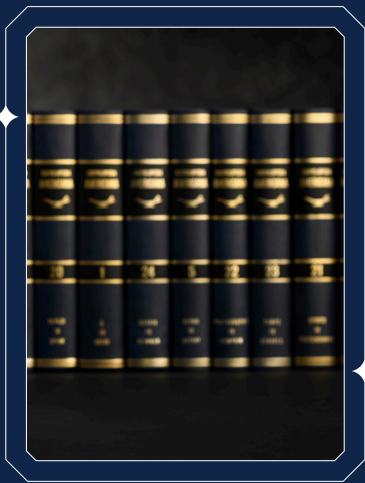
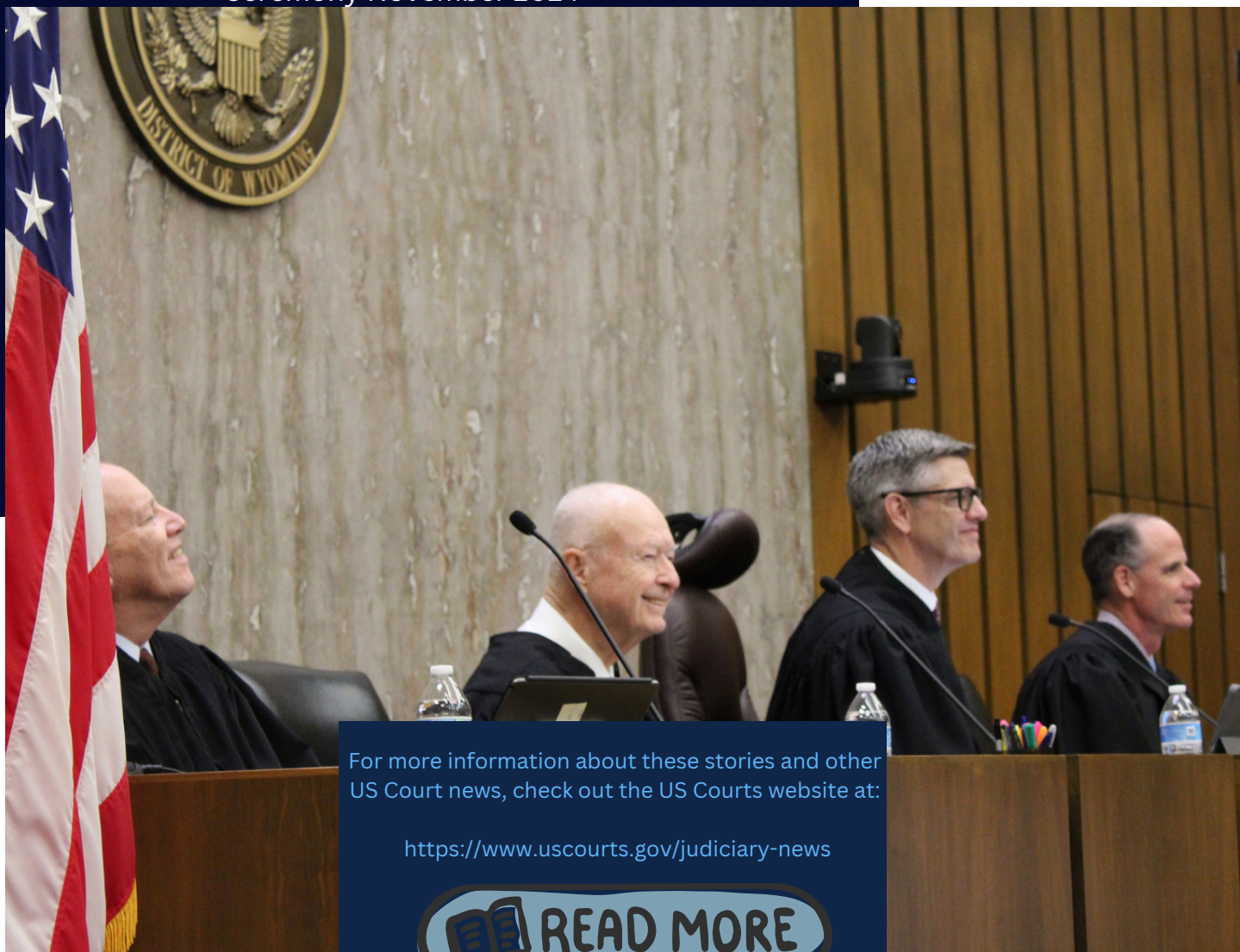
