Please remember that any documents sent to the WYDNewCase email address MUST have a scanned document containing an actual signature. An electronic signature of /s/ is not acceptable for this type of filing.

REMINDER WHEN FILING STIPULATIONS

When filing STIPULATIONS with the Court, please DO NOT USE the <u>Stipulation Event</u> in ECF for stipulated or unopposed motions. If counsel uses the Stipulation event in ECF to file these pleadings, the filing will not go directly to the Judge for ruling as Motions do.

It is imperative that any pleading asking the Court to issue a ruling must be filed under a Motion event. If you are unclear about this process or if you are ever unsure as to which event to use for a filing, please call the Clerk's Office and we will be happy to assist you.




Art in New Courthouses Convey Civic Pride & Symbols of Justice
