1           **(The proceedings commence at 3:39 p.m.)**

2           **THE CLERK:** All rise. Hear ye, hear ye, hear ye. The  
3 United States District Court for the District of Wyoming is now  
4 in session, the Honorable Judge Scott W. Skavdahl presiding.  
5 God save the United States and our Honorable Court.

6           **THE COURT:** Thank you. Please be seated.

7           Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to  
8 the Ewing T. Kerr Federal Courthouse for this Naturalization  
9 Ceremony. The Court will suspend the local rules on cameras  
10 and recording devices. I would ask, however, that any cell  
11 phones be turned to "silent."

12           It has been a tradition in these ceremonies granting  
13 citizenship to new citizens to recognize those citizens and  
14 families of those citizens who have paid the ultimate price in  
15 defending what so many in this world seek: The freedom and  
16 benefits of being a United States citizen. It is particularly  
17 appropriate, given that tomorrow marks the Eleventh Anniversary  
18 of September 11, 2001, a catastrophic event which forever  
19 changed our world.

20           Since then and predating that event, as of today's  
21 date, 6,594 American men and women have been killed in action  
22 while involved in military operations in Afghanistan, Operation  
23 Enduring Freedom; and Iraq, Operation Iraqi Freedom. In  
24 addition, 49,746 United States citizens have been wounded in  
25 action in these military operations. Let us take a moment of

1 silence and recognize these American heroes and their families  
2 whose sacrifice cannot be measured and whose loss will never be  
3 recovered.

4 (Silent tribute)

5 **THE COURT:** U.S. District Court for the District of  
6 Wyoming is in special session for the naturalization of foreign  
7 nationals to be United States citizens. It is with great  
8 honor, pride and privilege that I am able to conduct this  
9 ceremony on behalf of 20 new United States citizens originating  
10 from nine different countries throughout the world.

11 The Federal District Court of Wyoming, including  
12 Chief Judge Freudenthal, Judge Johnson and Judge Brimmer,  
13 extend their congratulations to you, your families and friends.

14 At this time, I would recognize the St. Anthony  
15 Tri-Parish Catholic School Choir to entertain us with songs of  
16 *America* and *America the Beautiful*.

17 Thank you for being here.

18 (St. Anthony Tri-Parish Catholic School Choir sings  
19 *My Country, 'Tis of Thee*, also known as "*America*"; and *America*  
20 *the Beautiful*.)

21 (Applause)

22 **THE COURT:** Thank you very much, boys and girls.

23 At this time, I would ask the deputy clerk of court to  
24 make a roll call of prospective applicants for U.S.  
25 citizenship. If you could please rise upon the pronouncement

1 of your name.

2           **THE CLERK:** Juan Carlos Ramirez. Marvier Claret  
3 Mursuli. Julianna Eckley. Sandra Godinez Frickson. Hyang Ran  
4 Maria Carricaburu. Catherine Ann Hatle. Andriy Boroday.  
5 Felix Raymond Weese. Maria Nancy Martinez Flores. David  
6 Matthew Tehau. Rafael Valdez Gomez. Aster Minoza Arionus.  
7 Abigail de la Cruz Schoenig. Rocio Esmeralda Linch. Losa  
8 Langi Munger. Victor Carlos Mena Romero. Maria Isabel Tellez  
9 de Mena. Kristine Bation Barton. Juan Alberto Enriquez. And  
10 Juan Alfredo Malave.

11           **THE COURT:** Thank you and you may be seated.

12           At this time, Mr. Shugart, on behalf of the  
13 United States Attorney's office, do you wish to present a  
14 petition?

15           **MR. SHUGART:** I do, Your Honor. At this time I would  
16 motion the Court for the naturalization of these 20  
17 petitioners.

18           **THE COURT:** All right. On the petition of the  
19 United States, the Court finds that the applicants identified  
20 and called have satisfied the legal requirements to become  
21 citizens of the United States and therefore grants the petition  
22 and will enter the order allowing these petitioners to become  
23 citizens of United States of America.

24           (Applause)

25           **THE COURT:** I must confess to you it's not often that

1 we have applause in a courtroom. It's usually not the place  
2 for it, but today is a fitting occasion that there is applause  
3 that should be given.

4 I would, at this time, recognize Colonel Schmotzer  
5 with the Natrona County High School Color Guard for the posting  
6 of the Color Guard.

7 Ladies and gentlemen, would you please stand.

8 (Presentation of colors by NCHS JRRTC Color Guard.)

9 **THE COURT:** Fellow citizens, it is your obligation and  
10 ours to show allegiance to this country at this time by making  
11 our pledge of allegiance. Then I'd ask you to remain standing  
12 for the singing of the national anthem by the St. Anthony  
13 Choir.

14 (Pledge of Allegiance recited; Star-Spangled Banner sung by  
15 St. Anthony Tri-Parish Catholic School Choir.)

16 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

17 Colonel Schmotzer, will you please retire the colors.

18 (Colors retired.)

19 **THE COURT:** Thank you, Colonel Schmotzer.

20 Thank you. Please be seated.

21 At this time, I would ask our newest United States  
22 citizens if you could please face me and raise your right hand  
23 and repeat after me. Please rise.

24 I hereby declare on oath --

25 **THE PETITIONERS:** I hereby declare on oath --

1           **THE COURT:** -- that I absolutely and entirely --

2           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- that I absolutely and entirely --

3           **THE COURT:** -- renounce and abjure --

4           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- renounce and abjure --

5           **THE COURT:** -- all allegiance and fidelity --

6           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- all allegiance and fidelity --

7           **THE COURT:** -- to any foreign prince, potentate --

8           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- to any foreign prince,

9 potentate --

10           **THE COURT:** -- state or sovereignty --

11           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- state or sovereignty --

12           **THE COURT:** -- of whom or which I have --

13           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- of whom or which I have --

14           **THE COURT:** -- heretofore been a subject or citizen;

15           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- heretofore been a subject or

16 citizen;

17           **THE COURT:** That I will support and defend --

18           **THE PETITIONERS:** That I will support and defend --

19           **THE COURT:** -- the Constitution and laws of the

20 United States of America --

21           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- the Constitution and laws of the

22 United States of America --

23           **THE COURT:** -- against all enemies, foreign and

24 domestic;

25           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- against all enemies, foreign and

1 domestic;

2           **THE COURT:** That I will bear truth faith and  
3 allegiance to the same;

4           **THE PETITIONERS:** That I will bear true faith and  
5 allegiance to the same;

6           **THE COURT:** That I will bear arms on behalf of the  
7 United States when required by law;

8           **THE PETITIONERS:** That I will bear arms on behalf of  
9 the United States when required by law;

10           **THE COURT:** That I will perform non-combat service --

11           **THE PETITIONERS:** That I will form non-combat  
12 service --

13           **THE COURT:** -- in the Armed Forces of the  
14 United States --

15           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- in the Armed Forces of the  
16 United States --

17           **THE COURT:** -- when required by law;

18           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- when required by law;

19           **THE COURT:** And that I take this obligation freely --

20           **THE PETITIONERS:** And that I take this obligation  
21 freely --

22           **THE COURT:** -- without any mental reservation --

23           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- without any mental reservation --

24           **THE COURT:** -- or purpose of evasion.

25           **THE PETITIONERS:** -- or purpose of evasion.

1           **THE COURT:** So help me God.

2           **THE PETITIONERS:** So help me God.

3           **THE COURT:** Congratulations.

4           **PETITIONER MARVIER CLARET MURSULI:** Thank you.

5           (Applause)

6           **THE COURT:** At this time, I would ask the clerk of  
7 court to assist in the presentation of certificates of  
8 citizenship.

9           Family members or others that wish to come forward and  
10 get a good picture, you may do so at this time.

11           (Certificates presented and shaking of hands of the new  
12 citizens by the Court and the clerk.)

13           (Baby in the gallery commences crying, and the father  
14 brings the baby to the "new citizen" mother seated in the jury  
15 box.)

16           (Laughter)

17           **THE COURT:** There's some things citizenship won't  
18 replace.

19           (Laughter)

20           **THE COURT:** Congratulations to you all.

21           (Applause)

22           **THE COURT:** At this time, I would ask the clerk of  
23 court to play a message to you from the President of the  
24 United States of America.

25           (President Obama addresses the new citizens via videotape.)



1           **THE COURT:** At this time, I would recognize members of  
2 Wyoming's congressional delegation. I would begin with  
3 Senator Enzi's office and Ms. Tinsley.

4           **MS. TINSLEY:** Thank you.

5           **THE COURT:** And I would also note the presence of  
6 Mr. McConnaughey on behalf of Senator Lummis -- or  
7 Congresswoman Lummis and Ms. Schlup on behalf of Senator  
8 Barrasso's office as well as Mr. Palner; and Mr. Phillips, and  
9 I'm -- oh, USCIS. Good to have you here today.

10           I believe that the congressional delegation has some  
11 letters that they wish to hand out at this time, and I would  
12 invite you to do so.

13           **MS. TINSLEY:** Thank you.

14           **THE COURT:** Thank you.

15           (Letters and packets handed to the new citizens by the  
16 congressional delegation.)

17           **THE COURT:** Thank you. At this time, I would  
18 recognize Mr. Stan Lowe.

19           (Mr. Lowe salutes the American Flag.)

20           **MR. LOWE:** May it please the Court.

21           **THE COURT:** Counsel.

22           **MR. LOWE:** Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen, and  
23 welcome. On behalf of the Veterans of Casper and Natrona  
24 County and Wyoming and the United States of America, we welcome  
25 you to our country as citizens. We congratulate you on your

1 wise choice. You had a choice the rest of us didn't but you  
2 chose wisely. You have now become part of the citizenry of the  
3 greatest nation in the history of the world. It is so, so  
4 great that many others in other lands are jealous, and they  
5 want to either destroy us or take over our country and that we  
6 have been standing steadfast against that; and we ask you now,  
7 as fellow citizens, to join us in this stand that we take with  
8 increasing frequency.

9           Eleven years ago tomorrow, at 8:46 a.m. Eastern  
10 Standard Time, airplanes operated by fanatics, who sought to  
11 justify their action by their religion, chose to crash into the  
12 two towers of the World Trade Center in New York, the Pentagon  
13 in Washington and were seeking another target in Washington  
14 when the passengers took charge and took over that plane, but  
15 ultimately it crashed.

16           Nearly 3,000 of us Americans died. Those people in  
17 the Twin Towers had gone to work that morning. That's all they  
18 did was go to work to do their job, to raise their families, to  
19 do the things that make the economy and this nation operate  
20 efficiently and effectively. They did nothing to harm these  
21 people who killed them.

22           The same can be said of those who got on the airplanes  
23 that day. Some got on there to tend to business, probably most  
24 of them, because that's the way we carry on our commerce in  
25 this country is through efficient transportation and

1 face-to-face negotiations and transactions. They did nothing  
2 unusual except to do their job. Others got on their airplane,  
3 going to see relatives or going on vacation to enjoy  
4 themselves, to have a happy time and to have the benefits of  
5 some restful relaxation. They did nothing to those who killed  
6 them, nothing whatsoever, and this is the kind of enemy we  
7 fight today. They don't even wear uniforms. They don't  
8 hesitate to violate all of the international rules regarding  
9 warfare. They will get in crowds of women and children so as  
10 to keep our troops from killing them. They will do everything  
11 they can to avoid the orderly conduct of war that governs the  
12 rest of us because they think their religion gives them an  
13 exemption.

14           This is most unfortunate but it is something for us to  
15 do every year in order to show our support of this country and  
16 those who have died in this fashion for it because it is the  
17 right thing for Americans to do. No one can kill any American  
18 without it affecting all of us. We are a family. Regardless  
19 of race, creed or color, regardless of background, we are  
20 Americans. We don't talk about being green Americans or purple  
21 Americans or anything like that. We are Americans and we stand  
22 together and we support each other, and that's what we do, and  
23 that's what we veterans have done.

24           My name is Stan Lowe. I'm the past chairman and now  
25 chairman emeritus of the Wyoming Veterans Commission. In

1 World War II, I served in both the Pacific and the Atlantic. I  
2 saw the damage; I saw the destruction; I saw the bodies, but  
3 this is all part of warfare. I'm pleased to be here in order  
4 to relate this to you because I was part of the invasion fleet  
5 for Japan, but President Truman spared us that honor when he  
6 dropped the bomb at Hiroshima that saved not only our lives but  
7 literally thousands upon thousands and thousands of Japanese  
8 lives because it brought to an end a war that should have ended  
9 before that except the war-makers of Japan were unwilling to  
10 seek peace before that.

11           So getting back to our subject at hand of the day that  
12 we are observing tomorrow, I want to tell you that the veterans  
13 of Natrona County every year put on a program to observe this  
14 event tomorrow. At eleven o'clock tomorrow at the Veterans  
15 Cemetery in the chapel, the Natrona County Veterans Council  
16 will conduct a service. Our Chief of Police, who happens to be  
17 a veteran himself, having served over in the Middle East in the  
18 Iraq, in the war on terror, will be the speaker.

19           I urge all of you to attend this. One of your duties  
20 and responsibilities as citizens is to observe and support the  
21 events that honor the people who have served our country in one  
22 form or fashion, whether it be the firemen and police that were  
23 on the job in New York, trying to help those people in the  
24 tower or whether it's the troops out in the battlefield that  
25 are representing you, that are defending you and each of you.

1           By the way, how many veterans are there here today?  
2       Would the veterans -- well, we have a good number today. So  
3       we're well represented. Thank you for your service, all of  
4       you. God bless you.

5           So I would urge you, all of you, to attend the  
6       function tomorrow, eleven o'clock at the Veterans Cemetery in  
7       the chapel, and you'll hear Chris Wallace, our Chief of Police,  
8       a fine gentleman, deliver, I know, an excellent presentation.

9           With that, I close my comments and again congratulate  
10      you on being one of us. We're glad to have you, and we are  
11      especially glad to be here to participate with you in this  
12      very, very important occasion.

13      (Mr. Lowe salutes the American Flag.)

14      (Applause)

15           **THE COURT:** Thank you, Mr. Lowe.

16           Ms. Margaret Everett on behalf of the Daughters of  
17      American Revolution who you're joined with, I believe you have  
18      a presentation you wish to make?

19           **MS. EVERETT:** You want me to -- can I speak about it?

20           **THE COURT:** Wherever you want, you can go to any  
21      microphone that you see.

22           **MS. EVERETT:** The Daughters of the American Revolution  
23      truly appreciate being able to welcome you to our great nation.  
24      We got here the easy way because we trace all of our -- all of  
25      us can trace our background back to the formation of the

1 country during the Revolutionary War. Today we admire you, the  
2 time and effort that you have taken to become part of us; and  
3 today, in our little envelopes, you will find a number of  
4 patriotic pamphlets, including the story of our National  
5 Anthem, our Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, some writings by  
6 Patrick Henry, a pamphlet on knowing your rights under the  
7 Constitution and the current Flag Code plus some others.  
8 Welcome.

9 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

10 (Packets presented to the new citizens by the Daughters of  
11 the American Revolution.)

12 **THE COURT:** While they're handing that out, I want to  
13 confess my appreciation and thankfulness for St. Anthony's  
14 Choir to come here today. They were called last week by my  
15 judicial assistant. I'm known as a very "forward looking and  
16 planning person," not --

17 (Laughter)

18 **THE COURT:** -- and so they were kind enough to agree  
19 and excited to agree, and I'm just very grateful that they  
20 joined us today.

21 Thank you, Ms. Everett.

22 Mr. Gary Cohee, on behalf of United Veterans Council  
23 of Natrona County.

24 (Mr. Gary Cohee salutes the American Flag.)

25 **THE COURT:** Mr. Cohee.

1 (Pins presented to the new citizens by Mr. Cohee.)

2 Mr. Cohee salutes the American Flag.)

3 **THE COURT:** Thank you, Mr. Cohee.

4 I also note the presence of Mr. Ron Akin and Mr. David  
5 Stortz on behalf of the Disabled American Veterans. Also I  
6 note Mr. Sanchez on behalf of the Marine Corps League.

7 (Mr. Akin, Mr. Stortz and Mr. Sanchez salute the American  
8 Flag, and pins are presented to the citizens. Mr. Akin  
9 approaches Mr. Sanchez for additional pins.)

10 **THE COURT:** Mr. Sanchez is going to have to empty his  
11 pockets.

12 (Laughter)

13 **MR. RON AKIN:** He's our secret stash here.

14 **THE COURT:** Thank you, gentlemen.

15 I would also recognize Mr. Gary Cohee on behalf of the  
16 American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary.

17 **MR. GARY COHEE:** Your Honor, this is Linda Feezer on  
18 behalf of the American Legion Auxiliary.

19 **THE COURT:** Thank you for being here today.

20 (Pins and flags presented to the new citizens by Mr. Cohee  
21 and Ms. Feezer.)

22 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

23 Are there any service organizations or other veterans  
24 organizations, patriotic organizations, that I have failed to  
25 recognize? All right. Thank you very much for your

1 participation.

2 Mr. Shugart, on behalf of the Attorney General of the  
3 United States, Eric Holder, are there any remarks you wish to  
4 make at this time?

5 **MR. SHUGART:** Ladies and gentlemen, on behalf of the  
6 Attorney General for the United States and on behalf of the  
7 United States Attorney for the District of Wyoming, we just  
8 congratulate each and every one of you for your accomplishments  
9 and wish you all the very best in your future endeavors.

10 **THE COURT:** Thank you, Mr. Shugart.

11 We're running on about an hour here, and it's amazing  
12 how much this place warms up when you have this many people in  
13 here.

14 (Laughter)

15 **THE COURT:** I'll be brief. This country was forged  
16 from the desire to form a more fair and just society and  
17 government, a government by the people and for the people. Its  
18 formation came at a great and, for many, an ultimate cost.  
19 However, that was but a down payment. As noted at the  
20 beginning of this ceremony, the price of our freedom continues  
21 to be paid, and tomorrow will mark a day 11 years ago when  
22 2,977 Americans lost their lives simply because they were  
23 Americans.

24 I hope that all of us recognize and appreciate we are  
25 united as Americans, and the freedoms we enjoy are not because



1 of our individuality but, rather, because of the commitment to  
2 one another as fellow citizens of the United States of America.  
3 Moreover, citizenship does not come without obligations. We  
4 are obligated and committed to one another to support and  
5 defend what we have, not our individual interests. We have a  
6 duty to serve, from military service to jury service; and we  
7 have a duty to participate in our government. After all, it is  
8 a government by the people. That is you. Citizens of many  
9 other countries see these duties as opportunities. May we  
10 always take the opportunity so that we continue to have the  
11 opportunity.

12 To our newest United States citizens, thank you for  
13 wanting to be a part of that collective commitment, and may  
14 those of us who have already made it or have been gifted with  
15 it be reminded what we have is cherished and sought after by  
16 others throughout the world. May that always be the case. May  
17 God continue to bless the United States of America.

18 We shall stand in recess. Congratulations.

19 (Applause)

20 **THE CLERK:** Court is now adjourned.

21 **(The proceedings conclude at 4:25 p.m.)**
